REA Scholarship Criteria One or Two awards of \$500 each

This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior, who in the opinion of the Randolph Education Association Selection Committee has demonstrated a passion for learning. Applicants must be in the top 25% of his/her graduating class and plan to attend a four year accredited college or university. Selection is based on academic record, behavior, attitude, character, leadership and sense of purpose.

Applicants are required to write a one page, double spaced essay describing their desire for higher learning.

*Special consideration will be given to students pursuing a career in education.

*Final applicant(s) will be approved by the REA.

REA Scholarship Criteria

- 1. Applicants must be in the top 25% of their class.
- 2. Applicants must be attending a 4 year credited college or university.
- 2. Education majors will be given first priority however all candidates will be considered. The education majors will not necessarily be awarded the scholarship.
- 3. Applicant must demonstrate their passion for learning. (Takes classes!)
- 4. Applicants must write a one page double spaced essay describing their desire for higher education.
- 5. Attitude/Behavior/Character/Leadership *Please see attached rubric.
- 6. The selection will be made by a three member committee. The final selection will be approved by the REA.
- 7. Scholarship will be administered at the end of the first semester assuming that the student remains in college.
